What do you need to know to be eligible?

If you are 60 years of age or older.

If your income is below 130%.

What will you receive in the food box?

Four cans of vegetables, two cans of fruit, two bottles of juice, one peanut butter or beans, two cereal or one bag of oats, two pounds of pasta or rice, two shelf-stable milk, one instant milk [six-times a year], one meat and one block of cheese.

What information will you need at registration?

Verification of ID, age & address using a driver's license, passport, picture ID card, birth certificate or similar document.

Verification of family income by bringing a W-2, the previous years tax return, social security award letter, last four pay stubs or similar documents.
